- > Together with the Leaders / Mayors of the 10 districts form the Greater Manchester Combined Authority


City of Manchester:



Population Development in Manchester



Post-Industrial City – 'Rebirth'

- Regeneration began in late 1980/90s (Metrolink, Arena, Bridgewater Hall)
- Gained momentum with 1996 IRA bombing near Arndale → city centre regeneration (Arndale, Printworks)
- 2002 Commonwealth Games
- Large parts of the city have been demolished, re-developed or modernised
- Old mills and warehouses converted into apartments
- City centre living from 500 to 50,000+












Intensive population growth in the core


Underpinned by a younger, more ethnically diverse, growing population



Our Manchester Strategy 2015–2025




Our Manchester Strategy 2015–2025

Job growth will be focussed in the core of the conurbation




Over 25% of all jobs in GM are located in Manchester






Manchester has three clear growth sectors to 2025

Greater Manchester Spatial Framework will set overall growth figure & distribution







Manchester's Health



Manchester has the highest rate of early death from respiratory (breathing) diseases in England. More than 64% of these deaths are considered to be preventable.



Manchester has one of the highest rates of **child poverty** in the country; with just over 32% of children aged under 16 living in poverty, and many live in homes where no-one is employed.



Nearly **4,000** people aged 16–64 in Manchester were long-term **unemployed** in 2014. This was 10.5% of the Manchester population.



In August 2015, there were **2,895** patients in Manchester diagnosed with **dementia**. The vast majority (95%) of these patients are aged 65 and over.



We have the highest number of **smoking-related deaths** in the country. Each year there are some 735 deaths and 4,760 hospital admissions due to smoking



Some 350 people under the age of 75 die from **cardiovascular** (heart) disease in Manchester each year.


