
Nordic Unity

The Nordic Urban Dance Network




Nordic Unity is a network of key people in the Nordic urban dance scene that was constituted in the spring of 2015. The network strides to bring the Nordic urban dance communities closer together, and through that strengthen the Nordic urban dance scene. By creating strong network in and between the Nordic urban dance communities, Nordic Unity strides to raise the bar in quality of urban dance and improve the professional and cultural conditions for all. Nordic Unity is realized with support from Nordiske Kulturfond.

To make transparent the purpose of Nordic Unity's work, the common will of Nordic Unity has been concretized in the Manifesto of Nordic Unity. In the manifesto is declared the goals of the network in relation to organization, business and professionalism, art, culture, teaching, articulation, communication, community and network in and of urban dance. The manifesto can be found on the website of Nordic Unity from sept. 4th 2015 where the website is launched and the Network is made official to the public. Nordic Unity Activities

The work and activities of Nordic Unity has various facets to reach the goal of heightening the conditions for and the quality of urban dance in the North. But throughout all activities and work there is one continuous work philosophy: All work and activities of Nordic Unity must work as rings in the water; the cognitive and behavioral changes, which the network advocates, must influence the Ambassadors' local dance communities as well as their possibilities for network and mobility must be spread to there. Following are a list of the main activities of Nordic Unity:

The Nordic Unity Conferences

Nordic Unity gathers at three annual conferences, the Ambassadors, representing 5 nordic countries, work to continuously establish a yet stronger platform for collaboration on the various projects of their local communities as well as for the network's own projects and productions. There is no hierarchy within the Nordic Unity core group, and each ambassador get to put in action their particular skill set in the areas of work that suit their particular abilities, collectively enriched with a wide range of high quality skill sets.

At the conferences, Nordic Unity strides to enter into dialogue with the local dance communities in two ways:

- On each conference, an open conference day is being held, where the network enters into direct dialogue with the local dance community.
- Through series of workshops, held on the conferences, where Nordic Unity is gathered, the network offers high quality workshops to the local dance community.

An effect of the work regarding the conferences is that the Ambassadors share knowledge, and through that develop new knowledge regarding the field of urban dance. This as well strengthens their individual work in the urban dance scene and allow these ambitious entrepreneurs a solid support network.

Common Support

The network strides to support urban dance events and projects in the various Nordic countries in matters of mobility, promotion and network. To do this, the network at the moment supports a range of projects and events created by the various Ambassadors of the network. By promoting each other's work; using each other's talents and capabilities to the best extend; and arranging transport and mobility to the events and projects in question, Nordic Unity strengthens and unites the urban dance scene in the North.

Nordic Unity Productions

Nordic Unity strides to make own productions to make projects, events and performances in the scene of urban dance of high quality. In 2016, three annual productions are to be made:

Juste Debout Nordic Festival 2016

The Nordic pre-selections to the Juste Debout 2016 finals in France. The event will be running from the 30th of January 2016 to the 2nd of February 2016 in Copenhagen and Malmö. The event will be managed and produced by Nordic Unity. More information can be found on the website from sept. 4th 2015.

Nordic Unity Dance Production

As a product of an artistic residency for a selected number of Nordic dancers in Copenhagen in the spring of 2016, a dance performance will be made collaboratively by the involved dancers. This production will be going on tour in on the third of the three annual productions of Nordic Unity; Nordic SuperJam 2016.

Nordic SuperJam 2016

Nordic SuperJam is to be a festival going on tour around the Nordic countries. The event will be based on jams, battles, workshops and performances all under the genres of urban dance.

The involved in Nordic Unity

As the work of Nordic Unity centers around the Nordic countries, the network consists of members from the countries of the North; Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Finland, Greenland and Iceland, while the search is ongoing for a representative of the Faroe Islands.

The Ambassadors in the network have all been chosen because of their key roles as leaders in their local dance communities. They have been chosen because of the impact of their work in the urban dance scene and their ability to stand alone, proving capable as entrepreneurs, artists, sportsmen & women, and loving community builders.

United Youth

In addition to the Ambassadors of Nordic Unity, you find the Ambassadors of Nordic Unity's daughter network, United Youth - a network for which the task is to direct the work and goals of Nordic Unity towards the new, younger generation of urban dancers in the North.

Nordic Unity Project Managers

Marie Kaae Schmidt

Marie Kaae is a teacher, organizer and international community builder dedicated to urban dance culture and art. She has more than 15 years of experience with professional dancing on television, in theaters, with pop-artist, award- and fashion shows and more. She holds a degree in cultural encounters and international development from Roskilde University in Denmark. Marie Kaae is the founder of Tap Water Jam, Paris edition and Copenhagen edition, a platform for culture and artistic socialization. Upon returning to Denmark in 2014 after several years living and working in Paris, She founded the Association Divercity, of which she is Chairman. Divercity works to support and develop the danish urban dance scene's continued growth and cultural coherence.



Marie Kaae is currently completing her second university degree in performance studies and psychology, along side various projects, performances, events, international battles and more.

Niki Tsappos 'Awandee'

Niki has her roots as a dancer in the dance scene of hiphop and in her work as a dancer, she travels the world representing Sweden in the international dance scene by teaching, giving workshops and lectures, doing performances, and participating in battles. She has won various battles around the world such as Juste Debout 2010 in Paris, WDC 2010 in Japan and Just Play 2015 in China. In the later years Niki has not only battled, but also functioned as a judge and MC on various dance events and battles. In sweden she has worked with several large theaters including the Dansens Hus, Riksteatern, and is behind an artistic exchange project between french and swedish dancers by the name of TMT. Niki was also behind the start up of Urban Connection Festival at Dansens Hus as an expert advisor on urban dance.



On an organizational level, Niki is a key dance event organizer in Sweden having organized events as Scandinavian Superjam and Pump up the Battle Tour.

Mikko has created two solo dance performances "Night på Bboy Mansion" (2002) and "Everyday Diary" (2004) and together with Flow Mo he co-created "3D" (2003), "Motion som Identity Footwork som Artform "(2004), "Døre - bag døre" (2008) and "Reaktion" (2009).

Today Mikko Teaches at Flow Mo's own dance school in Helsinki , where he is also project Manager and is part of the organizing team of the National Championships in Breakdance, amongst other events and competitions.
