Ulrich Lenz

Ulrich Lenz studied musicology, theatre studies and art history in Munich, Berlin and Milan. Since the 2012/13 season, he has been head dramaturge at the Komische Oper Berlin in the team of Barrie Kosky, with whom he has a long-standing collaboration.

Katie Mitchell

She began her career behind the scenes at the <u>King's Head Theatre</u> in London before taking on work as an assistant director at theatre companies including <u>Paines Plough</u> (1987) and the <u>Royal Shakespeare</u> <u>Company</u> (RSC) (1988 - 1989).[2] Early in her career in the 1990s, she directed five early productions under the umbrella of her company Classics On A Shoestring, [1] including Women of Troy for which she won a Time Out Award.

In 1996, Mitchell started directing operas at <u>Welsh National Opera</u> where she directed four productions, including Handel's <u>Jephtha</u> and Jancek's <u>Jenůfa</u>. Since then, she has directed operas at houses, including the <u>Royal Opera House</u>, <u>English National Opera</u>, <u>Glyndebourne</u>, the <u>Salzburg Festival</u>, <u>Berlin State Opera</u>, the <u>Royal Danish Opera</u>, <u>Opéra-Comique</u> (Paris), <u>Geneva Opera</u> and the <u>Aix-en-Provence Festival</u>.

Mitchell was an Associate Director at the Royal Shakespeare Company between 1996 and 1998. In 1997, Mitchell became responsible for programming at <u>The Other Place</u>, the RSC's former <u>black box theatre</u>. While at the RSC she directed nine productions, including <u>The Phoenician Women</u> which won her the <u>Evening Standard Award</u> for Best Director in 1996. Between 2000 and 2003 she was an Associate Director at the <u>Royal Court Theatre</u> and between 2003 and 2011 she was an Associate of the Royal National Theatre.[3] Cultural Fellow at King's College, London 2015 –Present, Honorary Fellow at Rose Bruford College, London 2014, Visiting Fellow at Central St Martins, London 2016 – 2018, Visiting Professor of Opera at Oxford University 201.

Simon Steen-Andersen

Since 2018 he is teaching composition and music theatre as professor at the University of the Arts Bern (HKB), Switzerland and as associate professor at the Royal Academy of Music in Aarhus, Denmark.
