ALEXANDRA JESPERSEN:

Alex has been actively involved in theatre since the age of 6, when she joined the "Frederiksberg Youth Theatre" in Copenhagen.

From 2003 - 2009 Alex took part in many productions both on stage and screen. She has appeared as the lead in films such as: "Vera's Vision"-Alex Cole and "Being Lego"-Ole Bornedal. As well as many theatre productions of all scales.

Since moving to England in 2009, Alex remained active within the acting world and has taken part in several productions, produced by the Marlowe theatre, the Gulbenkian theatre, National theatre connections and East15 Acting scool.

She has also played the lead in a national promotional film for

the NHS and Childline campaign "Looking out for Lottie", and various short films. In 2016 she returned to Denmark to perform as Ophelia in "Hamlet Live" at Kronborg Castle, where she has now performed three seasons. She continues to play in various productions both on screen and stage.




BENJAMIN STENDER:

Benjamin Stender graduated from The European Academy of Dramatic Arts in Italy in 2012.

He started off with his first professional job taking on the role of Christian de Neuvillette, in one of Italy's biggest productions of Cyrano de Bergerac, that toured the country for 2 years. Soon after, he inlisted in Cucchini Acency in Rome, that led to numerous roles for Italian tv productions and international films and series.

While working in front of the camera, he also kept himself busy on the stage, travelling between Rome and Copenhagen. In 2014 he was awarded the Reumert for up-coming talent, for his potrayal of the young Arthur Kipps in "The Woman in Black".

The latest of his works include the American produced film "Gore" staring Kevin Spacey, and the international series "The Name of The Rose", based on Umberto Eco's bestseller from 1980. Both projects released in 2019.



IAN BURNS:

He has lived and worked in Denmark since 1990. Before Ian came to Denmark he worked in repertory theatres in Manchester, Harrogate, Sheffield, Coventry and Scotland. He also appeared in the original musical productions of Lennon and Blood Brothers in London's West End. JEFFERSON BOND:


Jefferson Bond is an actor, writer and comedian from the UK. He graduated with a first class honours from East 15 Acting School in 2015 and since then has worked all across both Britain and Europe in theatre, film, voice and screen.

He has performed in several Shakespeare productions over the years including 'The Taming of the Shrew' and 'Much Ado About Nothing', the latter of which was in collaboration with the Shakespeare Birthplace Trust in the UK and for the past two summer seasons starred in an interactive performance of 'Hamlet' at Kronborg Castle. Most recently he has just finished a production of Edward Albee's 'The Goat or Who is

Sylvia' which toured in both Sweden and Denmark. Also as of 2016 he has become the youngest cast and collective member of "The Crazy Christmas Cabaret" at Tivoli, Copenhagen.

Jefferson is also an accomplished stand up comic, having performed alongside some of the biggest names in Danish comedy and has recently been chosen to perform his one man stand up show 'My Life as a Rockstar Astronaut and Other Lies' at Lund Comedy Festival 2019 in Sweden and will be touring Denmark for Zulu Comedy Festival 2019 which is one of the largest comedy festivals in Northern Europe.

Alongside his performing credits he has done voiceover work for some of the biggest companies in world which include recording for Mærsk Shipping, Copenhagen Malmö Port, TV2 and was the voice of the national Lego Harry Potter advert screened nationally across the UK.

Kevin is an Australian Actor. He graduated from the VCA (Victorian Collage of the Arts) in 2010 and since has been working professionally in Theatre, Film and TV. He has lived in Denmark for the past 2 years.

Linda trained as an actress at the Odense Theatre school of drama, from which she graduated in 1997.

Following her graduation she was part of several productions at the Odense Theatre where she, among several others, could be seen as Lise Munk in the play *Reverend Munk*. In 2003 she one of three women in the Jomfru Ane Theatre's great succes *Girls Night Out*, which was directed by award winning director Kamilla Wargo Brekling.

She has also worked with the Copenhagen based English theatre company *That Theatre Company*, in *Casanova Undone* and *Shakespeare's Women*.

Linda Elvira is the daugther of an English mother, which makes her bi-lingual and she has a fluent Standard English. A skill she frequently uses, not only on stage, but also in her work as a voiceover artist and cartoon dubber.

In 2009 she played a central role as the police agent Karen Bell in the Canadian independent feature film AURUM. Linda has also had roels in several of DR - the Danish Broadcasting Coorporation's - award winning tv series such as *Better Times, Unit One* and *The Bridge*.



RASMUS EMIL MORTENSEN:

Rasmus trained as an actor at the esteemed Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts in London, we he worked with some of the world's most renowned actors and directors.

Since graduating Rasmus has appeared in numerous plays and acted in a variety of short-films.

More recently he has been a part of a Danish feature film as well a TV series in Denmark. Rasmus has played Claudius in Hamlet at Kronborg Castle during the summer of 2018.

Søren Højen graduated from the Stella Adler Studio of Acting Conservatory in New York in 2010. After finishing school he spent a year in LA and then moved back to Denmark to educate himself further at the National Danish Drama School in Odense.

Since graduating in 2017 he has worked mainly in theatre, playing Ross in Macbeth at Odense theatre and Hamlet in Kronborgs Hamlet Live.

Recent credits include his much praised portrayal of Jimmy Porter in John Osbornes classic "Look Back In Anger" at That Theatre Company in 2019 and Romeo and Juliet at Vendsyssel Teater

In 2020 he played the part of Daniel in O.C. Madsen film "Powder Keg" about the terrorist attack in Copenhagen in 2015.



THEA BELL SCHOK:

Thea Bell Schok began her career in musicals where she got her first professional role in "The jungle book " in 2007. She then went on to play Petra in Fanny and Alexander at the Danish Royal Theatre 3 years in a row.

THOMAS MAGNUSSEN:

Thomas trained as an actor at the internationally renowned drama school the Guildhall School of Music and Drama. His first job upon graduation, was a small part in the HBO hit series Band of Brothers. Since then he has appeared in numerous films, TV- series and stage productions primarily in Denmark, but also abroad.

In the summer 2017 Thomas was the first ever Danish actor to play a leading role at the The Royal Shakespeare Company in Stratford upon Avon.

In 2008 Thomas won Aarets Reumert with long time friend and colleague Lars Mikkelsen, for their Shakespeare show "Flammens Muse - Muse of Fire."

In 2010 they were once again nominated for the award, with their production of Shakespeare's Twelth Night.

Recent credits include parts in the Danish drama series *The Legacy II, The Bridge III* and the new Nordic Noir series *Follow the Money*.

Thomas also plays second male lead in the independent feature *Secluded*, which premiered in 2016 and came in second in the "best feature" category at Cinequest 2017.

Thomas had his debut as director in the short *Opposite a Track,* produced by 2 time Academy Award winner M&M Productions; a film in which he also played the lead.

LARS MIKKELSEN:

At the age of 27 and after having been five years on the road as a juggler, Lars decided to become a real actor. So he applied at the Statens Teaterskole (National Theatre School of Denmark) in Copenhagen, where he was accepted and where from 1991-1995 he carried through his acting training. Shortly afterwards he had his debut as an actor in the play "Dracula" at the Aalborg Theatre. Since his graduation from the theatre school, Lars has appeared in more than 40 plays up to now (2012) and he has always wanted to keep on acting onstage. Again and again he was to be

With his role in the successful Danish crime series <u>Forbrydelsen</u> (2007) (The Killing), playing the mayoral candidate "Troels Hartmann", he received even more awareness. This led to roles in international productions, such as the villain in an episode of the British series <u>Sherlock</u>(2010), the Russian president Viktor Petrov in the third season of <u>House of Cards</u> (2013) and a leading role in the international crime series <u>Mord Uden Grænser</u> (2015).

For some of his performances in movies, films or plays he has received various nominations and awards so far.
