I 2024 arbejdede vi i Settlementet Vesterbro for første gang sammen med Assemble Theatre Collective i forbindelse med Saxogade Festival og Kulturnat. Det var en fantastisk oplevelse for os, for vores brugere og for det lokale vesterbro-publikum.

I Settlementet tror vi på det enkelte menneske og de stærke fællesskaber. Vi arbejder for at sikre håb og forandring og styrke mennesker, der lever i social udsathed. En vigtig del af dette arbejde er vores events, der skaber fællesskaber, møder på tværs af sociale skel og integration af mennesker ramt af udsathed. Samarbejdet med Assemble understøttede præcis det formål.

Assemble arbejdede respektfuldt med historier fra de mange mennesker, der kommer i Settlementet og Saxogade. Historier, der blev vakt til live gennem skæve og sjove forestillinger og performances til Kulturnat og Saxogadefestival. Publikum kunne opleve forestillingerne ved at gå på opdagelse i vores socialøkonomiske butikker og café.

Det, der gjorde samarbejdet ekstra særligt, var, at Assemble inddrog mennesker fra vores fællesskaber direkte i forestillingerne – side om side med professionelle skuespillere og performere. De var med som skuespillere, musikere og frivillige værter, og de fik også lov til at være med til at planlægge deres egne oprædener.

Det betød enormt meget for dem, der deltog, men det gav også forestillingerne en nerve og autenticitet, som gjorde oplevelsen endnu stærkere for publikum.

I 2021 og 2022 søgte Assemble Theatre Collective Kulturhavn Festivals open call og blev en del af festivalprogrammet med aktiviteterne:





THE HIDDEN HARBOUR
(free event at Kulturhavn Festival)

August 2021, Sydhavnen, Copenhagen

A test-theatre event set in Sydhavnen's harbour using audiences from the Kulturhavn Festival to try tools and strategies for creating interactive and immersive theatrical works in an urban location. Short scenes were devised in collaboration with local people from the area. Actors tested different techniques for creating interactive moments with the audience that put them at the heart of the piece.

Audiences interviewed afterwards on:

- the impact of the interactive elements
- the impact of the environment

- the audience demographic
- comments and suggestions for future development of a creative piece.

KEY FINDINGS:

- strong feelings of connection in the audience and to the cast characters
- audiences new to Sydhavnen were now keen to return to the area.
- 50% danish and 50% mixed international audience, most living in a district adjacent to Sydhavnen (for example Amager, Valby, Vesterbro)
- Audiences wanted to see a larger scale show and explore a larger area.


February 2020, Dexter's Bar, Copenhagen

An immersive re-telling of Krapp's Last Tape by Samuel Beckett, set in 2040 post climate disaster. The play was completely sold out and ran for a week in an underground bunker in Copenhagen.

The year is 2040. Denmark has been destroyed by a series of devastating floods brought on by climate change. Those who remain live alone, cut off from all human connection. One man, aging in solitude, clings to all he has left: memories of the old world, stark against this bleak and terrifying present. The play offers a human angle to the growing global climate crisis, exploring how our actions and their consequences shape our future.


